Cheaper Broadband and Phone Packages

Social Tariffs – what are they?

Social tariffs are cheaper broadband and phone packages that are available for people claiming Universal Credit, Pension Credit and some other benefits. They are delivered in the same way as normal packages, just at a lower price. They are offered by all of the major providers but the deals are often far less prominent on their websites than standard tariffs.

Aspects of Social Tariffs

- Cheaper than a regular package: Current prices range from about £10 to £20.
- Fast, unlimited broadband: Several tariffs offer broadband speeds over 25Mb/sec, which is fast enough to use the internet for streaming films, shopping, using websites, gaming etc.
- Low cost: Setup costs are minimal or even zero but, unlike standard deals, they typically do not offer special introductory discounts for the first year or so.
- Free to switch: Social tariffs can usually be switched to free of charge.
- Free to leave: No exit fee if terminated before the end of the contract.
- Predictable price: Social tariff prices don't go up mid-contract.

Note that the terms and conditions of a particular contract may differ from the typical aspects listed above, and should be checked before any contract is entered into.

Who is eligible for a social tariff?

All of the major providers also include people on Universal Credit, Pension Credit, Employment and Support Allowance, Jobseeker's Allowance and Income Support. Some providers also include additional benefits such as Personal Independence Payment and Attendance Allowance. The person receiving the benefit must be the main person on the contract.

How to apply

First, check if your current provider offers a social tariff. Our table below lists all of the tariffs available now. You can apply for most tariffs online, or call your provider and ask to switch.

If your provider doesn't offer a social tariff, you can switch to one that does. Your provider might let you leave your current contract without paying a penalty fee. Read our guide to switching broadband to find out more.
